We name aloud before God people, situations and contexts for which we feel called to pray.

Lord, in your mercy
All Hear our prayer.

Peace

The peace of the Lord be always with you
All And also with you.

Thanksgiving

*Gifts of bread & wine are offered through
which God will meet us in this Eucharist.*

Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation:
through your goodness we have this bread
to set before you, which earth has given
and human hands have made. It will
become for us the bread of life.
All Blessed be God for ever.

Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation:
through your goodness we have this wine
to set before you, fruit of the vine and
for of human hands. It will become for us
the cup of salvation.
All Blessed be God for ever.

Pour upon the poverty of our love and the
weakness of our praise the transforming
fire of your presence.
All Amen.

*The celebrant leads us in the preface prayer
which ends:*

How wonderful the work of your hands, O
Lord! As a mother tenderly gathers her
children you embraced a people as your
own. When they turned away and
rebelled your love remained steadfast.

From them you raised up Jesus our Saviour, born of Mary, to be the living bread, in whom all our hungers are satisfied. He offered his life for sinners and with a love stronger than death he opened wide his arms on the cross.

Pour out your Holy Spirit as we bring before you these gifts of your creation; may they be for us the body and blood of your dear Son.

On the night before he died, he came to supper with his friends, and taking bread, he gave you thanks. He broke it and gave it to them, saying:

Take eat: this is my body which is given for you.+

At the end of supper, taking the cup of wine, he gave you thanks, and said:

Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me. +

Father, we plead with confidence his sacrifice made once for all upon the cross; we remember his dying and rising in glory, and we rejoice that he intercedes for us at your right hand.

As we eat and drink these holy things in your presence, form us into the likeness of Christ, and build us into a living temple to your glory.

Remember Lord your Church in every land. Reveal her unity, guard her faith, and preserve her in peace in communion with *Justin* our Archbishop and *Sarah* and *Joanne* our bishops.

Bring us at the last with the Blessed Virgin Mary, Peter, our patron, and all your Saints to the vision of that eternal splendour for which you have created us; through Jesus Christ, our Lord, by whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever.

Lord's Prayer

As our Saviour taught us so we pray:

Send us out in the power of your Spirit

to your praise and glory. Amen.

presence to transform our lives and the lives of
those around us.*
